PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL: The monthly meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council held on Mon 14th May focused mainly on the following: (1) Initial proposals for changes to the Church building and its layout. (a) Parishioners who contacted members were positive on improvement to the heating system in the Church and whatever would help maintain heat in the church. (b) Some parishioners disliked the idea of removing a number of seats and shortening more of them. Others saw it as important for gathering the congregation together, for ease of movement on health and safety grounds and for providing a space that can function in many ways, e.g. sympathising with families at the end of a funeral mass, having displays for the different seasons of the Church's year, and as a gathering space always available in the Church.

(2) The meeting decided that for this year, the Corpus Christi procession on Sunday 3rd June after the 11am Mass will take the following route: From the Church to The Pines, past the Health Centre, down Park Road to Cois Abhann, where Benediction will take place, and then return to the Church via Park Road and Chapel Street. It is important to have enough stewards available on the day. Anyone willing to fulfill this role please contact any member of the Parish Pastoral Council. (3) Members discussed and will give further consideration as to how better to integrate children into the celebration of the Eucharist and if this might be possible as part of 'Do This In Memory'.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPELS - JOHN 15:26-27, 16:12-15

Jesus recognised that his disciples were not capable of taking in everything at once. Wisdom comes slowly and sometimes painfully. Hearing the 'right' answer at the 'wrong' time does not help us. We need to be ready and open to receiving the truth if it is to have any impact. Perhaps you can recall some occasions when it was the 'right' time for you to learn a truth about life. Remember your experiences of growth in understanding.

The Spirit can guide us to understanding in different ways. Understanding may have come to you when you were praying or reflecting on your life. Perhaps the Spirit guided you through the words of someone close to you, or through the words and actions of people you read about, or saw on TV. Remember and give thanks for the people who have helped you to greater wisdom in life.

Jesus said the Spirit would 'glorify' him by reminding the disciples of Jesus' own teaching. To whom do you give glory by taking their wisdom and incorporating it in your life? Are there people who give you glory by using your wise advice in their lives?

Wisdom is handed on from person to person, and from generation to generation, within families, within communities, etc. Are there any particular gems of wisdom that you cherish from what has been handed on to you? What wisdom would you like most of all to pass on to those close to you?
